A BYLAW TO PROHIBIT CHILDREN BEING ON THE STREETS AFTER THE HOUR OF 10 PM ON WEEKDAYS AND 11 PM ON WEEKENDS

## BYLAW NO. 1/96

The Council of the Northern Village of Green Lake in the Province of Saskatchewan under the provision of Section 101 of the Northern Municipalities Act enacts as follows:

- This Bylaw shall be known and referred to as the "Curfew Bylaw" of the Northern Village of Green Lake.
- No child under the age of Sixteen (16) years, or appearing to be under the said age, and lacking definite proof of age, shall be on the streets of the Village of Green Lake after the hour of 10 PM on weekdays and 11 PM on weekends and every such child shall be in his or her home after that hour throughout the night.
- Nothing contained in this bylaw shall apply to a child who is on the streets for some unavoidable cause or who is accompanied by or in the charge of a parent or guardian, who is over the age of eighteen (18) years.
- Any child found on the streets or away from his or her home in contravention of the provisions of this bylaw may be warned by the Municipal Curfew Officer or any Police Officer of the community to go home and, if after such warning such child is loitering on the streets, he or she may be taken by such officer or Police Officer to his or her home.
- Any parent or guardian who permits a child to contravene the provisions of this bylaw after being warned in writing by the clerk is puilty of an offence and shall, upon conviction before a Justice of the Peace or Judge having jurisdiction, be liable to a penalty of twentyfive (\$25.00) dollars for the first and each subsequent offence.
- This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon approval by the Minister of Municipal Government.
